

Spellings, reading and homework.

Towards the beginning of each term, children will be sent home with a sheet of week-by-week spellings. The new spellings will be introduced to the children in school, weekly on Mondays. Children are expected to practice these spelling words at home, and they will then be tested on these spellings the following Monday.



Children will bring their reading books home from school, which will be in line with the children's AR levels. We continue to ask that **all children** read at home at least **four times a week** and kindly ask that an adult signs the reading record to record this has been done – (children **should not** be filling these in themselves when they read independently). If children

are choosing to read books at home by themselves, please try to make yourself available to them to support with their reading or understanding of any unfamiliar words they may encounter.

TT rockstars should also be used regularly to support them in practicing their times tables. This will greatly benefit all of the children in their maths fluency but is especially important for the children in year 4, who will be completing the multiplication check towards the end of year 4.
