News From Preschool:

At preschool the children have been listening to the story of Goldilocks and the three bears. As part of their learning, they have been measuring porridge oats with spoons, counting out the spoons they need to fill the bowls.

This week the children have talked about cold, warm or hot food and sweet or salty food.

The children have been singing new songs, including 'When Goldilocks went to the house of the bears', 'Mix the porridge up' and 'Oats & beans and barley grow'.

After acting out the story, the children sat on a hard chair and a soft chair. We let the children feel inside the feely box, take out an object and choose if it needed to be put on the hard or soft tray. We have also looked at different sized chairs and the children have learnt lots of words to use for small, medium and big.

During outside play the children played with a parachute bouncing teddy bears up high in the sky, then they spent time mixing shades of brown paint to paint bears pictures.

We are already preparing ready for our celebration of Somerset day. We have been making bunting to decorate the hall for the Friends of the school's Ceilidh on the 10th of May (a barn dance!). We hope you can come along to celebrate with us.
